## **CRID Bohol Hosts Assessment**



To review the project implementation progress, share and examine experiences on implementation and partnership building, reflect on challenges and lessons learned, and draw out recommendations to foster better implementation and partnership, the Project Assessment was successfully organized last June 11, 2013 at the Metrocenter Hotel, Tagbilaran City. This

significant event was participated by the CRID Bohol team composed of the project staff, the consultants, and the BCCI's outgoing and incoming Presidents, the Vice President for External Affairs and the focal person of the CRID project, the corporate secretary, and the auditor; the grant provider, The Asia Foundation (TAF) which team was headed by Ms. Bing Bonoan; the Coalitions for Change team spearheaded by Mr. Joey Mendoza and the development partner, the Australian Agency for International Development (AusAID) team represented by Mr. Andrew Parker, loiie Camelon and Erika Geronimo.

The Assessment affirmed the good work the team has been doing and challenged them to continue to champion road reform in the province and broaden coalitions for change.

## **PDC Approves BRIB**

The Provincial Development Council (PDC) Resolution creating the Bohol Road Investments Board (BRIB) which shall serve as the clearing house of all the road investments in the province and the recommendatory body that shall endorse strategic road links was approved in the PDC meeting last June 15, 2013 presided by the Governor of the province of Bohol, Atty. Edgar M. Chatto, at the Bohol Tropics Resort, Tagbilaran City. The approved Bohol Road Investments Board (BRIB)

shall also serve as the monitoring body that shall assist the LGUs in prioritizing strategic links and a coordinating body that shall mobilize support and resources for priority roads. The board shall promote the creation and maintenance of a database of public roads.

The proposal was presented to the council by the focal person of the CRID project, Argeo Melisimo. There were questions asked by the council after the presentation such as on how the board will work with the Road Sector Committee dealing closely with the Provincial Road Management Facility (PRMF) that looks after provincial roads and on the selection process and criteria of the pilot LGUs.

The team clarified that the PRMF takes care of provin-

cial roads only and that this works closely with the Road Sector Committee. The Road Sector Committee reports to the Bohol Road Investments Board (BRIB) which purview shall be beyond provincial roads.

They further explained that in choosing the pilot LGUs, the consideration includes one representation per Integrated Area of Development (IAD). They also identified which of the 47 municipalities are Economic Growth Areas and which needs for pump priming. Lastly, that the LGU has a close to complete roads database and the presence of a Geographic Information Systems (GIS) operator.

The approval of the creation of the Bohol Road Investments Board (BRIB)is a key turning point, a significant milestone of the project that went through tedious discussions and reflections by the project team. From the Further, the board shall promote the creation and concept of an Executive Order Creating the Road Sector Council (BRICC) that later on, was elevated to a Provincial Road Investments Board (BRIB). This salient win of the project calls for further hurdles to surmount which may include gathering the members and giving them the orientation and rationale of the project and the created board; convincing them of the significant role they will play being members of the board and as a board; and guiding them in the first few meetings to facilitate seamless coordination.
